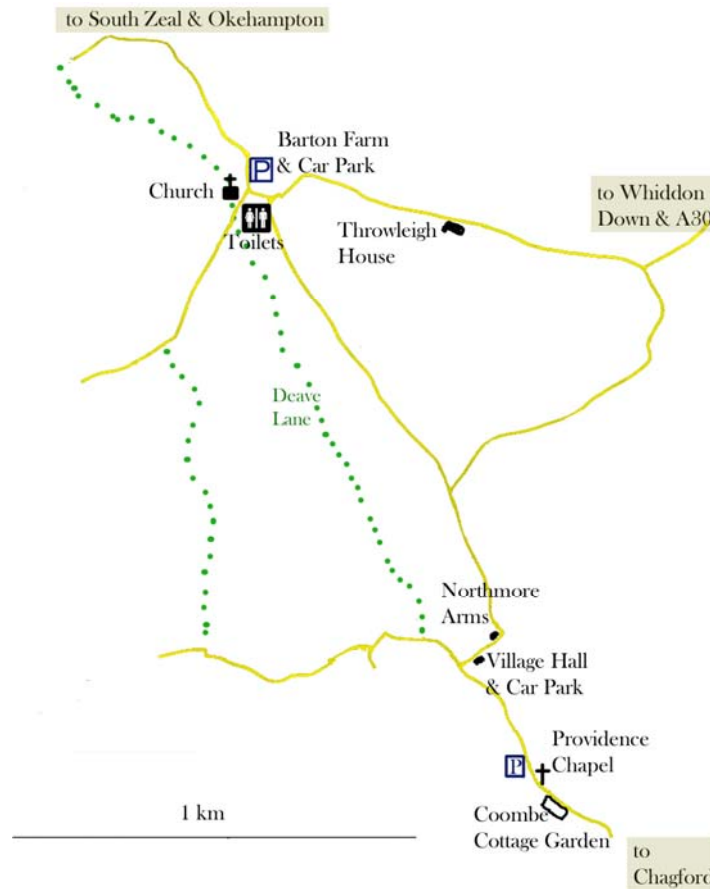
Festival Concert, Sat. 25th April, 7.30 pm

Throwleigh is a parish of about 300 people on the north-eastern fringes of Dartmoor, approximately three miles from Chagford and six from Okehampton. The granite church (mostly 15th and 16th century) and its Church House (now privately owned) form the centrepiece of 'Throwleigh Village'. The parish and its proximity to the high moor have attracted and served as a source of inspiration for artists, writers, musicians and photographers, for very many years.

It may be surprising to discover just how much talent thrives in even the smallest communities. This festival is the inspiration of a group of people living in the parish, who feel that this talent deserves to be better known to a wider audience. Another impetus for the festival is to promote a wider use of St. Mary's Church, by encouraging everyone in the parish to get involved (whatever their talents and beliefs). We hope that this may help the continued survival of this remarkable building.
